# **ABOUT BLACK NATIVITY**

"Black Nativity" is an adaptation of the nativity story by Langston Hughes, performed by an entirely black cast. Hughes was the author of the book, with the lyrics and music being derived from traditional Christmas carols, sung in gospel style, with a few songs created specifically for the show. The show was first performed on Broadway on December 11, 1961, and was one of the first plays written by an African American to be staged there. The show had a successful tour of Europe in 1962, one of its appearances being at the Spoleto Festival of Two Worlds in Italy. The tour revisited New York for an encore performances at Lincoln Center.

The original name for this play was "Wasn't It a Mighty Day?" You might find it interesting that original cast members like Alvin Ailey and Carmen de Lavallade quit the production before opening day because they objected to the use of the word "black" in the title. The rationale at the time was that this word might be too divisive for a Broadway production aimed at keeping things harmonious with all audiences. Ultimately, black in the title did not matter. This liberating and energetic musical opened to rave reviews.

In 2004, a documentary film was made about the world premiere performance, production, and creation of the best-selling gospel Christmas album "Black Nativity - In Concert: A Gospel Celebration," and the cast, under the direction of Aaron Robinson, brought it to life at the Immanuel Baptist Church in Portland, Maine.

A filmed version directed by Kasi Lemmons and starring Forest Whitaker and Angela Bassett was released on November 27, 2013.

You'll find a production of this musical performed in churches, theaters, on college campuses, and more in almost every major U.S. city and other regions. It is a joyful retelling of St. Luke's story of the birth of Christ by way of gospel music, dance, poetry, and narrative.

# **ABOUT LANGSTON HUGHES**



Langston Hughes' work, which was a significant part of the Harlem Renaissance ran from poetry, social activism, novels, plays, and working as a columnist. His innovative poetry was referred to as "Jazz Poetry."

# MEET OUR DIRECTOR



Sharia Benn is the co-founder, President, and Executive Artistic Director of the Sankofa African American Theatre Company (SAATC) based in Harrisburg, PA. She is a Baltimorean and an "artivist," using the canvas of theater to educate and amplify African American stories, and create healing spaces for theater artists and audiences. Sharia is an award-winning actress, living-history interpreter, playwright, producer, and director.

Since SAATC's founding and establishment as a 501(c) (3) organization in 2017, more than 15,000 students and adults have experienced thought-provoking theater under Sharia's artistic direction. In May 2023, the regional arts community recognized SAATC's transformative work by honoring it with the Distinguished Arts Organization Award.

Beyond her theater work, Sharia has a special passion for increasing representation and amplifying the African American experience through engaging productions. She skillfully combines acting and historical insights to resonate with contemporary audiences, particularly when exploring

local history and the remarkable story of Frances Ellen Watkins Harper, a renowned abolitionist, literary figure, and civil rights champion of the mid-19th century.

In her corporate career, Sharia boasts over thirty-five years in the Property and Casualty insurance sector. She currently serves as the Director of Corporate Planning & Special Projects for Penn National Insurance, where she also leads the company's workplace inclusion group. Sharia holds a BA in Mass Communications from Towson University and has earned the insurance industry's most prestigious designation, the Chartered Casualty Property Underwriter (CPCU).
